Cinema and Lunch


No October or November Meetings

A review on 20 September showed Clean Energy Generation was 32% of total at Dec 2021-Tasmania and South Australia with exceptional results. Whilst rooftop solar still leads the way, wind generation is not far behind. Victoria has plans to develop offshore wind by 2028—maybe a first. Local production may well be some way off but the first steps are underway. China has a monopoly position in wind turbine manufacture.

Energy storage by battery and pumped hydro also progressing, along with Synchronous motors, were major part of distribution efficiency.

Vic Compare Energy site was reviewed and assumptions noted.
