The gardens appreciation group brings the stunning Blue Lotus Water Garden as its first garden experience for 2023. The garden claims to have the world's most extensive collection of different lotus flowers producing millions of huge and beautiful flowers. The garden also has a collection of banana 'trees' and giant Amazon waterlilies.

This famous garden is at 2628 Warburton Hwy, Yarra Junction - about an 1 hour drive from the Balwyn Leisure Centre so we will car pool from the Balwyn



Leisure Centre leaving at 9:30am.

To enjoy this fabulous display of magnificent lotus flowers, you will need to ensure that you advise Liz Dawe by email or text [see email address in the club membership booklet] by our February meeting but no later than Friday 10 February clearly indicating if you can provide transport for others (and how many) or if you need transport.

"Seniors" entry costs \$20.50 – payable at the gate and, at your own cost, the Lilly Ponds Café can provide a light lunch – eat in or take-away to enjoy in the garden. Numbers greater than 15 (in total) may require a group booking which may also require a package including lunch and consequently a different cost. All who indicate attendance will be advised of any necessary changes in arrangements. For information about such packages please see the Blue Lotus Water Garden website.

While the garden has wheelchairs available for loan, the operator advises visitors that the gardens are 'ASSISTED wheelchair friendly' as there are some minor slopes and the trails are not sealed. There is an accessible toilet.



FOUR INGREDIENT BAILEYS CONDENSED FRUIT CAKE.

1kg mixed dried fruit

400g can condensed milk

3/4 cup Baileys Irish Cream liqueur

2 cups self raising flour.

METHOD

- 1. In a large bowl, combine dried fruit, condensed milk, Baileys and 1/2 cup water. Mix well, cover and refrigerate overnight.
- 2. Remove from fridge and stir well, allowing it to come to room temp. Preheat oven to 150C. Grease and line a deep 20cm round cake tin with Baking paper.
- 3. Fold flour through soaked fruit. Pour into prepared tin and smooth top.

Bake for 2 hours until skewer inserted into centre comes out clean, checking it at the 1 1/2 hour mark and covering with foil if browning to quickly. Denise B's recipe, by popular request!
